

Michael Daniels is the executive director of the Florida Alliance of Assistive Services and Technology (FAAST). Michael has been working in the assistive technology field for over 20 years with a

focus on computer access and seating and mobility. He served as program director at FAAST for four years and was instrumental in the development of the statewide device loan program and the addition of two Regional Demonstration Centers.

Keynote Speaker

Yessenia Leyva advocates for people with disabilities through speaking, entertainment, event-planning, building relationships, and raising awareness on a variety of topics. In



2011, she was named Ambassador of Change through the Broward Children's Center and the Leadership Broward Program for her work educating school children about disabilities and bullying. Her goals are to fight for inclusion and make people everywhere aware that persons with disabilities have ABILITIES.

Michael Lincoln is a member of FL SAND's Stand Up for Independence self-advocacy group. He is also a member of the Treasure Coast-Fort Pierce Guardian Angels. He is



enrolled at Indian River State College and recently started a Best Buddies chapter in his community. Michael is passionate about advocating for individuals wanting to live independently and currently serves on the Supreme Court of Florida's WINGS (Working Interdisciplinary Networks of Guardianship Stakeholders) group.



Paula Roberts is the external affairs coordinator for Disability Rights Florida. Her role is to educate individuals with disabilities, their caregivers, and state agency representatives on how to access

services from local, state, and federal agencies. Her trainings include "How to Become an Efficient Self-Advocate," information on transition services, systemic issues, and obtaining information and resources from Disability Rights Florida.

Ashley Wolfe is a research liaison at the Institute for Community Inclu-



sion at the University of Massachusetts, Boston. Her research is about ways for people with IDD to succeed at school, at work, and in their communities. She has presented research findings at conferences and mentored self-advocates in Florida. Ashley was awarded the first-ever Research in Action award by The Arc in 2011. In 2014, she received the Disability Law Center's Individual Leadership Award.

Amanda Baker, a selfadvocate from Panama City, is president of FL SAND and vice-chair of the FDDC. She is a graduate of Partners in Policymaking and recipient of the 2015 Idelio Valdes

Award. She founded the Elephant Herds self-advocacy group in Panama City. Amanda has significant experience in public policy and advocacy and is employed full time as a vocational rehab technician. John Finch serves as the director of ABLE United at the Florida Prepaid College Board. Previously, John served at The Arc of Florida in various capacities, including director of dental ser-



vices, which helps individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities receive much needed emergency dental care. With experience in both the financial sector and non-profit social services field, John strives to make a difference in people's lives.

Katrina Washington has worked for the Agency for Persons with Disabilities since 2009, currently in their state office as an operational review specialist where she provides technical



assistance and training for employment liaisons and supported employment providers and businesses. She has a passion for supported employment and is eager to see people with disabilities obtain and maintain successful employment.



Natalie Alden has been working in the disability rights field for more than 30 years, the last 14 as a senior advocate-investigator with Disability Rights Florida where she focuses on Social

Security, employment, and health insurance issues. She has worked hands on for systems change through working on pilot projects that have gone on to national implementation and organizing grassroots empowerment groups. She was awarded both the Ron Halsey Memorial Award and the Jack Gillrup Community Leadership Award.


